MAYOR/BOARD

MINUTES

The board made a motion by Trustee Catalano, seconded by Trustee Holbrook and was carried unanimously to approve the minutes of 5/20/19 and 6/6/19.

RESOLUTION #11-2019 ADOPTING UPDATED POST-ISSUANCE TAX COMPLIANCE PROCEDURES

The following Resolution was approved on a motion by Trustee Holbrook, seconded by Trustee Lutes and was carried unanimously.

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Service has issued regulations requiring issuers of tax-exempt obligations to certify on various forms that they actively monitor compliance with federal tax rules following the issuance of such obligations; and

WHEREAS, the Village is a periodic issuer of tax-exempt obligations and thus is subject to the aforementioned compliance requirements which are critical for the preservation of the preferential tax status of those obligations; and

WHEREAS, it is therefore in the best interest of the Village to adopt formal written procedures to ensure such compliance and to designate an official responsible for ensuring that such procedures are followed; and

WHEREAS, the Village has previously adopted post-issuance tax compliance procedures (the "Prior Procedures"); and

WHEREAS, it was intended that the Prior Procedures would be periodically updated and supplemented; and

WHEREAS, Hodgson Russ LLP, as bond counsel to the Village, has prepared (and has recommended that the Village adopt) updated and more comprehensive post-issuance tax compliance procedures;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village hereby adopts the updated post-issuance tax compliance procedures that are attached hereto as "Schedule A" and resolves to be governed thereby; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the below Schedule A will be placed in its entirety in the official records, files, and minutes of the Village and adhered to going forward; and be it further RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

MONTHLY OVERTIME REPORTING

The board made a motion by Trustee Holbrook, seconded by Trustee Lutes and was carried unanimously to eliminate monthly overtime reporting and to just have quarterly emails to the village board members, with the Police Department to report monthly as would normally be done.

DISCUSS ADDING MONTHLY REPORTING FOR ONGOING PROJECTS

The board made a motion by Trustee Holbrook, seconded by Trustee Catalano and was carried unanimously to add monthly reporting of ongoing projects, including the Fire Department, (handicapped restroom and renovations at the Fire Hall).

POLICE DEPARTMENT

MONTHLY OVERTIME REPORT

The board made a motion to approve the Monthly and Overtime Report of 65.25 hours by Trustee Catalano, seconded by Trustee Lutes and was carried unanimously.

It was recommended that in the Police Report rather than saying "Incidents in the Town"; it be reworded as "Incidents Outside of the Village".

FIRE DEPARTMENT

MONTHLY REPORT

Report will be forthcoming.

COUNTY

Chief Ruch reported that they have put the County on 1st alarm within the town and village in an attempt of having better protection in Westfield for proper care of patients.

Further, Chief Ruch stated they have 9 new members and are waiting on background checks for 2 or 3 of the new applicants in the Fire Department.

DONATION OF DEFIBRILLATOR FOR WELCH FIELD POOL

It was brought to the attention of the Fire Department that there was no Defibrillator located at the Welch Field Pool and they will present one to Andrew Webster for use up at the Pool area, it is a simplified version and easy to understand and use, and has both pediatric and adult pads, etc. It just requires periodic checking of the batteries. The presentation will be made over at the Fire Department tonight at 8:00 p.m. for anyone who would like to attend.

EMT DISCUSSION

Chief Ruch discussed the EMT requirements for certification. He noted there are now 3 active; and in the department, 5. A person must complete 78 computer hours and take a test at the end; also they need to come up with details on how many calls the individual answered and they must do training either through Squad Night or be on an Active call. i.e. CPR, choking, splinting, bleeding control, etc. The cost of the Refresher Course is

\$300 per person and the EMT Certification is good for 3 years. As the CME program is set up now, the \$300 keeps rotating every time they refresh.

The \$300 had to be sent to the County when they first enrolled in the program. Every time they recertify that is reimbursed back to the Village.

The question was raised that if the County was 1st on the Alarm card would they be billing the resident for that call? The Chief replied that if the ALS intercepts and does ALS work, yes. If it's the paramedic that's on the call and there is no EMT and the paramedic transports, yes, there could be a bill but it would be less than an ALS call.

REQUEST EXECUTIVE SESSION

CODE ENFORCEMENT

MONTHLY REPORT

The board made a motion to approve the Code Enforcement monthly report by Trustee Lutes, seconded by Trustee Catalano and was carried unanimously.

RECREATION DEPARTMENT

WELCH FIELD POOL

It was noted the Pool was experiencing some mechanical difficulties but it was anticipated it would open as of tomorrow, June 18, 2019.

MONTHLY REPORT

The board made a motion to approve the monthly report by Trustee Catalano, seconded by Trustee Lutes and was carried unanimously.

SEASONAL EMPLOYEES

The board made a motion by Trustee Holbrook, seconded by Trustee Lutes and was carried unanimously to approve the additional seasonal employees; John Emmons and Lucy Knappenberger.

PUBLIC WORKS

MONTHLY/OVERTIME REPORT

The board made a motion to approve the monthly report and overtime report of 23.95 hours by Trustee Lutes, seconded by Trustee Catalano and was carried unanimously.

MOORE PARK TREE DISCUSSION

Following discussion including a report from Forester Bruce Robinson and Tree specialist Bill Bentley:

The board made a motion by Trustee Holbrook, seconded by Trustee Lutes and was carried unanimously to approve for the removal of the three (3) trees which have become problematic.

Ed noted that when a tree begins to be an issue it gets brought to the board for discussion and that some of the trees in the park have been donated by people in memory of a family member so they sometimes would need to be made aware of what will be happening with that tree and if action needs to take place.

UPDATE ON BUSINESS PARKING LOT

Ed noted that he believes all the street poles are in for the street lighting, and all the curbing and all materials are in for the beginning of the parking lot, the only thing necessary now is to have a time to begin. He feels it will be the middle of July when they can start construction back up again.

UPDATE ON PORTAGE INN SITE-FIRE AND POLICE MEMORIAL SITE A retaining wall needs to be constructed for the driveway that is going to be put in.

The board made a motion to authorize, subject to permissive referendum, withdrawing the funds in the amount of \$15,000 out of the Community Enhancement Reserve Fund to donate to the Northern Chautauqua Community Foundation towards the site by Trustee Catalano, seconded by Trustee Lutes and was carried unanimously.

Ed noted that approximately \$13,000 of that amount would be used towards the building of the retaining wall.

UPDATE ON NICHOLS AVENUE DRAINAGE

The Public Works Dept. is hoping to begin the drainage project this week. They are caught up on restoration from other projects but still looking for topsoil to finish up, dealing with water main breaks and sewer main issues. Tractor Supply is about two weeks behind due to inclement weather.

WATER & SEWER DEPARTMENT

MONTHLY AND OVERTIME REPORT

The board made a motion to approve the Water monthly report and overtime report of 41.75 hours by Trustee Lutes, seconded by Trustee Catalano and was carried unanimously.

The board made a motion by Trustee Catalano, seconded by Trustee Lutes and was carried unanimously to approve the Sewer monthly report and overtime report of 19.7 hours.

UPDATE ON UPGRADES TO WATER DEPARTMENT

Contract #1; which is all the water main work, is basically complete. Just some yard restoration needs to be finalized. Driveways and sidewalks on West Main are finished.

Contract #2; which is the Bliss Street pump station and the generator at the Water Plant is complete. They Issued a Change Order for a \$59,000 credit as that contract came in under budget.

Contract #3; which is the Water Plant building which is underway currently. All the windows are out waiting for the masonry work to be done. The roof is scheduled for some time in July. Some additional cost with the masonry work on the building itself, must be done but it is still within the contract amount. The chimney can be eliminated.

Contract #4; the filters at the Plant. The decision was made to go with the new clarifiers rather than just cleaning what is there which would be highly labor intensive to accomplish. The savings and the labor costs from the contractor offset part of the cost of the media.

Filter #1 is done. It has been sandblasted, painted, and all the repairs have been made to it. The new blowers are in for the air water backwash system. The plan is scheduled for startup on June 24th.

UPDATE ON UPGRADES TO SEWER DEPARTMENT

Sewer Plant Upgrade Phase 2 has begun. Electrical contractor has been in and put the conduit in for the panel out back up to the driveway. Getting the stainless-steel piping in has been somewhat difficult.

Replacement of the UV disinfection system. We received a letter from the DEC and they are going to make us disinfect with chlorine for that month or so period of time that the UV system is out of service. Fortunately, they are not going to make us de-chlorinate as that would have been another cost.

PURCHASE OF ZERO TURN MOWER/SKID STEER

The board made a motion to approve the purchase of a zero-turn mower/skid steer in the amount of \$3,870 for the Sewer Department by Trustee Holbrook, seconded by Trustee Lutes and was carried unanimously.

ELECTRIC DEPARTMENT

MONTHLY OVERTIME REPORT

The board made a motion by Trustee Catalano, seconded by Trustee Lutes and was carried unanimously to approve the monthly report and overtime report of 24 hours.

REQUEST TO HIRE OSMOSE

It was recommended that an inspection be completed every 5 years on the poles and it has been 5 years since last inspection.

Per recommendation by the DPW Advisory board, the board made a motion by Trustee Catalano, seconded by Trustee Lutes and was carried unanimously to hire Osmose to do pole inspection of our 115 kV transmission line in the amount of \$13,537.50.

APPROVE MRB PROPOSAL

The board made a motion by Trustee Holbrook, seconded by Trustee Lutes and was carried unanimously to approve MRB Engineering/Grant Services proposal not to exceed \$15,000.

AWARD BID FOR GENERAL LINE CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL

The board made a motion by Trustee Lutes, seconded by Trustee Catalano and was carried unanimously to award the bid for General Line Construction Material to Irby, (see attached).

CHANGE ORDER FOR NEW ELECTRIC BUILDING – C&R CONSTRUCTION

The board made a motion by Trustee Catalano, seconded by Trustee Lutes and was carried unanimously to approve the Change Order for the New Electric Building items as presented (see attached).

TREE BOARD DISCUSSION

Discussion regarding the formation of a Village Tree Board was tabled until the next Village Board meeting.

UPDATE ON THE NEW ELECTRIC BUIDING

The building itself is up, the outside is basically finished other than the garage doors need to be installed, framing up the partition walls, offices etc. Scott Electric is working on a layout and IEEP should cover all of the cost of all of the LED lighting as the Village will be installing it. They are hoping to be out of there by Mid-July. The plan is to get the electrical service installed next week. The inside work can be accomplished over the winter. We will have to hire a contractor to come in to install overhead radiant heat which would be the most feasible to have in that building.

TREASURER

The board made a motion to approve the monthly report by Trustee Catalano, seconded by Trustee Holbrook and was carried unanimously. There was no overtime.

UPDATE ON MOVING BILLING OFF CURRENT POSTCARDS

Logics Software Company went through a business process review May 29th & 30th with the Treasurer's Department and have put us on their list for an upgrade which will possibly begin in the Fall.

All labor material and equipment for the following:

- 1. 5,200 square feet of 6" concrete
 - Excavate existing material for pads as required, leaving all waste on site.
 - Form and pour approx. 140'x35'x6", 20'x10'x6" and 25'x4'x6" thick apron in front of all overhead doors (finish grade to be determined).
 - Broom finish, saw cut all control joints and apply one coat cure and seal.
 - Strip all forms, no finish grading to pads is included.

Price for the above described work \$ 20,100.00

All concrete, wire mesh, sealer and material for fine grading is not included in the above quote.

2. Liner panel
